Human life is sacred

No one can and should defend destruction of human life

True, huge loss of life has taken place in Naxal conflict ... both by Maoists and Security Personnel

Statistics show comparable figures of Killings by both..

According to Chhattisgarh Police, In 2008, 212 people were killed.. 63 Sec. and 52 Naxals.. In 2007, 369 people were killed.. 124 Sec. and 64 Naxals... In 2006, 385 people were killed... 39 Sec. and 69 Naxals...

Civilian casualty is far more and who did it is not known!

Nothing but cold-blooded murderers....

What about Fake encounters? Custodial deaths? Extra-judicial killings? and Structural violence killing people in millions?

Deaths in Pure Police Violence

Direct

7468 Killed in Police Custody in 2002-07 or 7333 deaths (2006-2009) as against total 3116 killings by Police and Naxals
Average 1500 -1850 deaths/y as against estd 417 deaths in naxal violence
These figures do not include deaths in custody of armed forces and Indian army

Structural Violence of State

- More than 1.8 lakh farmers committed suicides
- 2 Million children below 5 years are killed annually
- 4 lakh new born die within 24 hours every year

According to Police Total **1416** people lost lives in Naxal conflict; **212** in 2008

Total **1593** farmers committee suicide in 2008 alone!

Average 35 people killed in Naxal conflict per month According to NCRB, Average 120 farmers are killing themselves per month

- It is grounded in a particular ideology, one may agree with or not
- It challenges prevailing paradigm of political economy




It can only be dealt with by addressing the problem of this oppression and exploitation

Indeed,

- many in the state machinery including politicians individually acknowledged this fact
- Manmohan Singh posited that the Naxalite problem had "a strong socio-economic dimension" that was at the very heart of the issue.

However,

As the State their response always reflected that Naxalism was just a Law and Order problem, a menace warranting police brutalities.



With the transformation of the State character from one constricted by the constitutional social contract to the

Neo-liberal blatancy.

It has been shifting to naked unconstitutional strategies, such as Salwa Judum

-the state-sponsored and supported movement, where tribals were armed to fight their own people assumed to be naxalites

And now, the Operation Green Hunt



Advances in labour displacing technologies, production organization, product-market changes, financilaization of economies...

creates a different paradigm which does not need poor people



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It's a paradigm of Dispossession, very different from the familiar capitalist paradigm of Exploitation

It means virtual killing of excess people ... some 2 billion of total 6 billion

At the root of all this lay the treasure beneath the forest..


Chhattisgarh is the richest State in terms of natural wealth, with 28 varieties of major minerals, including diamonds....

However, there is no hiding the fact that the strategy has backfired

It resulted into inhuman tragedy to the local tribals ... killings, rapes, repeated destructions, and displacement ... over 50,000 still remaining missing.

Pressure Build-Up

Since 2001, the government concluded deals (MoUs) with several steel and power companies to establish plants by 2010.

More than 100 MoUs for total investment of Rs.3.26 trillion.

Most MOUs have time frame validity

During the last three years, >18 of these MOUs amounting to over Rs. 10,000 crores investment had lapsed.

While they could be signed again, it created pressure on the government to take drastic measures.

That measure is the Operation Green Hunt

Operation Green Hun

Virtual zoo of paramilitaries: Black cats, Cobras, Grey Hounds, Scorpions, Octopus, Tigers with various hues ranging from Green to Black...



Supplementing these carnivores are the Border Security Force, Indo Tibetan Border Police, Central Reserve Police Force, Armed Border Force, Naga Batallion, Rastriya Rifles...laced with sophisticated new weaponry and support from the regular army and air force.

Backed by corporate Honchos in five star hotels and first class airport lounges ...

The objective is

to clear the area of Naxalites – (read Tribals), 'sanitize' it and hand it over to the MoU'ist corporates.

- Huge unprecedented Constitutional crisis
- Risk of politicization of paramilitary and armed forces
- Unlikeliness of success as Adivasis never knew Surrender
- Certainty of increase in Maoist ranks
- May succeed in short term but certain to fail in long term
- Risk to national integrity
- Huge human cost and human rights tragedy

Does not the filthy life style of the rich put you down?


Do you really have any voice?
